Mr Sidiki KEITA is an Engineer in Animal Husbandry. He served as a government official in the Ministry of Fisheries and Aquaculture since 1992. From 1997 to 2000, he worked as a seconded officer in the implementation of several pilot fish farming projects, mainly in the Forest Region. From 2000 to 2012, Mr. KEITA held the position of Regional Director of Fisheries and Aquaculture in the 'Forest Guinea' region, and led several new initiatives with a simple slogan: "No competition between operators but rather complementarity and synergy of actions". From 2012 to June 2018 he served as the first National Director of Fish Farming of Guinea, and he has been invited to represent his country in various international events dealing with climate, environment, water, agriculture and rural development, including the last UN FAO Subcommittee on Aquaculture of the Committee on Fisheries in Italy and various Conferences of the Parties (COP) of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, as he included agroecological fish farming among the 12 concepts of Guinea's Nationally Determined Contribution (NDCs) of the Paris Agreement. On July 24, 2018 Mr Keita was appointed the first Director General of the newly created National Agency for Aquaculture in Guinea (ANAG).
